



AAP, AAFP, AAPD RECOMMENDATIONS:

Currently, the American Academy of Pediatrics and the American Academy of Family Physicians recommend preventive oral health services be provided to children during well-child visits. Additionally, the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry recommends the establishment of a dental home by age one.
